Grade 12—Schedule of Events

It is of great importance that all grade 12 students participate in this final academic activity. Failure to participate could have a large negative effect on an individuals final GPA. In addition to working on the senior pro-

ject during May 15th to May 21st, grade 12 students will be receiving additional lessons to assist in their final Ministry Arabic Exams. *Beginning May 21st classes are concluded for grade 12 students.* The senior graduation will take place on June 9th, 2018.

Model United Nations—Grade 11 and Grade 12 (Assigned by Ms. Rania Elhabashy)

On May 15th grade 11 and grade 12 students will be participating in a United Nations exercise. Two groups will be created. 4. Think Win-Win - Adopt a growth mindset. Each group will be researching topics related to real work areas 5. Seek to Understand and Be Understood - Manage feelings of crisis. This day long exercise will have one group focusing on Economic / Social world issues. Areas of study to be examined 6. Synergize - Focus on strengths. in this group will be violence against woman, child labor and refugees. The second group will focus on world security. One primary topic will be examined, the use and controls of nuclear energy. The day will be lead by our grade 12 students. Students in grade 11 will compose various countries being represented on the two councils. Each council will have thirty students participating in the activity. The exercise will be assessed and the results of the assessment will be applied to the social studies mark for term four. Areas to be assessed include evidence of research, organization of ideas, debating skills and the degree of viability of resolution created.
